## NOTRE DAME PREP AND MARIST ACADEMY KICK OFF FALL SEASON

The varsity football team started the season with a convincing victory over Algonac at home on Thursday, shutting out the Muskrats 38-0. Phil Sakalian had 80 yards on 9 carries, quarterback David Owenby ran for 48 yards and 2 touchdowns on 11 carries, Branch Kampe ran for 46 yards and 2 touchdowns, and Chad Powers scored two safeties.

JV football fell to Algonac on the road 39-0 on Wednesday.

Marist football opened the season against Ann Arbor St. Francis on Friday at home. Varsity was defeated 27-6 and JV was defeated 19-6.

Girls golf fell to Cranbrook Kingswood 199-215 in the first match of the season. They bounced back with a 203-215 victory over Lahser the next day.

Boys cross country placed 9th at the Michigan Catholic Invitational in Lansing to start the season. Brad Lorant (13th) and Chris Burns (18th) were the top finishers for the team. They placed 8th at the Adams Invitational on Thursday, once again led by Lorant (14th) and Burns (19th).

Girls cross country placed 4th at the Michigan Catholic Invitational. Top finishers for the team were Risa Juliano (12th), Alayna Lekosiotis (14th) and Rachel Hanson (18th). They placed 6th at the Adams Invitational, led by Sara Barron (32nd) and Juliano (33rd).

Varsity boys soccer fell to Oakland Christian 5-0 in their season opener but rebounded to top Williamston 3-0 in their next game. They were defeated by Catholic Central 4-0 in their third game but evened up their record at 2-2 with a 5-2 victory over Riverview Gabriel Richard on Saturday. Neil Al-attar scored all five goals for the Irish.

JV soccer fell to Lahser 5-0 in their first game of the season. They followed up the loss with a 2-1 victory over Williamston. They were narrowly defeated 2-1 by Catholic Central and fell 8-0 to West Bloomfield last week but squeaked out a 1-0 shutout victory over Riverview Gabriel Richard on Saturday. Glenn Sullivan scored the goal and Hayden Smith got the shutout in goal.

Boys tennis was defeated by DeLaSalle 8-0 in their opening match. They fell to Divine Child 6-2 on Thursday. Mac McLean won #2 singles and Chad Barnhart and Mike Morrison won #1 doubles for the Irish.

Girls swimming and diving placed 3rd at the Kenzie Classic at Howell Parker High School. Jaclyn Wilson won the 100 Yard Breaststroke with a state finals qualification time.

Varsity volleyball opened their season at the West Bloomfield Invitational. They advanced to the finals where they were

defeated by Farmington in two close back and forth games. At the Lake Orion quad, they defeated three Class A teams (Rochester, Romeo and Lake Orion). They lost only one game all night. JV volleyball opened their season at the Farmington Invitational. They had a record of 4-3 on the day and advanced to
