Chesley in the 100 Backstroke.

Varsity volleyball (8-2) fought

at home, but could not hang
on for the victory. After drop-
ping the first two games 25-17
and 25-23, they battled back to
win the next two 26-24 and
25-22. The fifth game went to
Divine Child 15-8.

JV volleyball defeated Divine
Child in two games, 25-22 and
25-14. They fell to Marian in
two games 25-11 and 25-9.

Freshman volleyball is unde-
feated in the league after top-
ping Divine Child in two games
and Marian in two games, 25-
