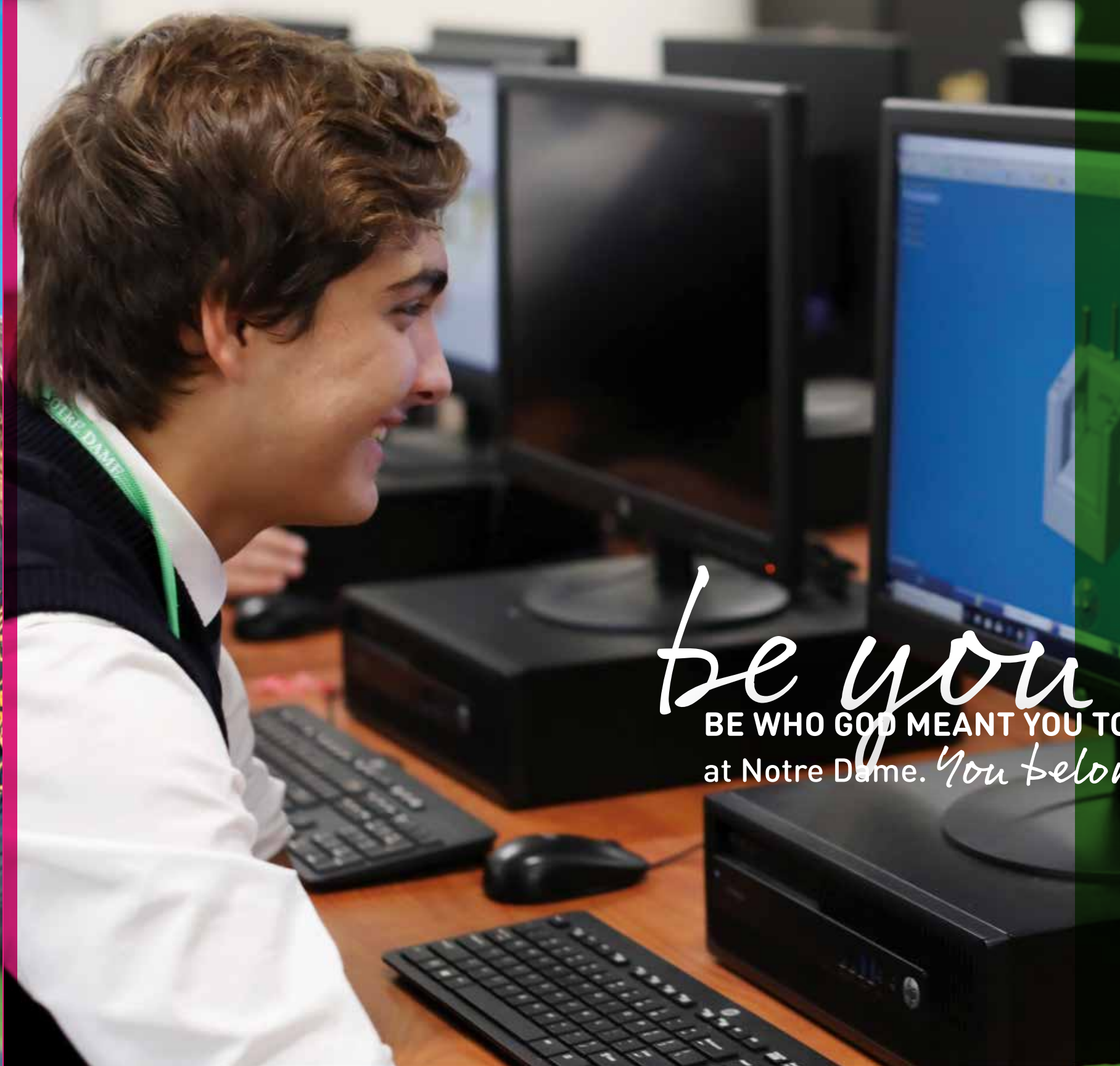

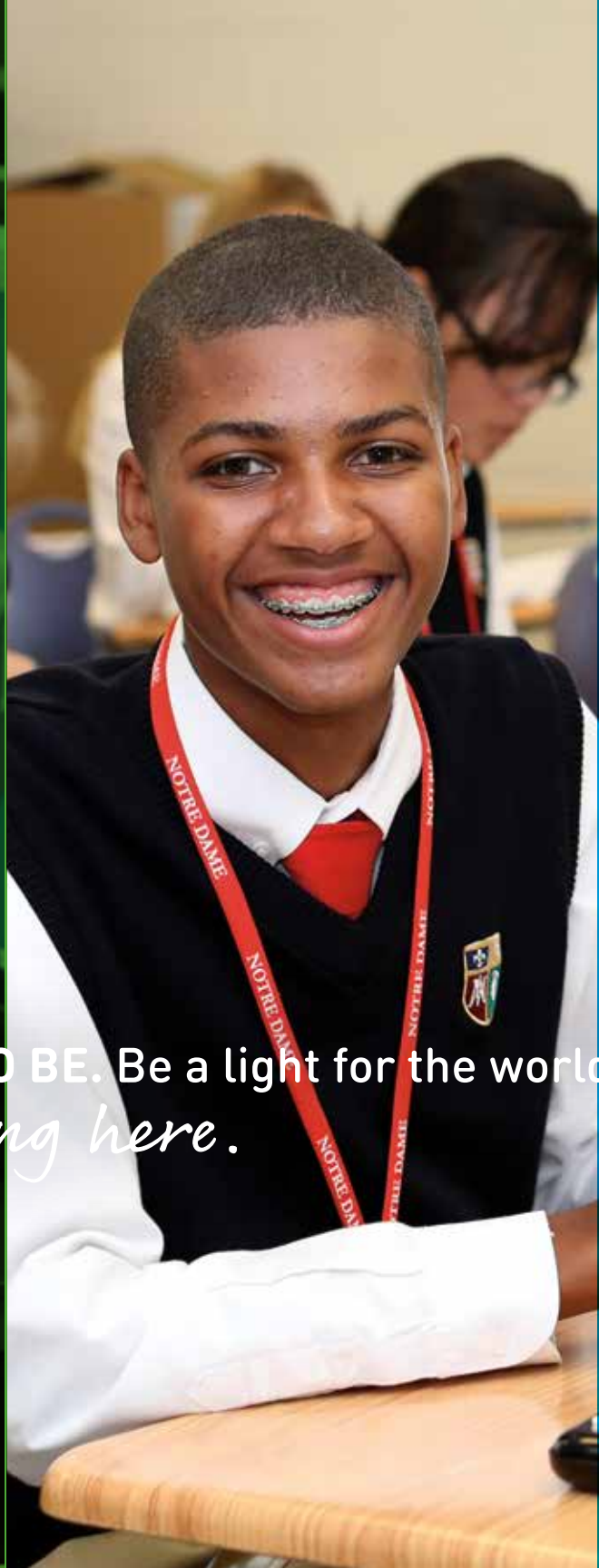


STUDENT PEERS PAY IT FORWARD

NOTRE DAME PROVIDES ITS DIVERSE STUDENT BODY A CATHOLIC AND INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNIZED COLLEGE-PREPARATORY EXPERIENCE OF LASTING VALUE. OUR MISSION: WITH GOD, WE FORM CHRISTIAN PEOPLE, UPRIGHT CITIZENS AND ACADEMIC SCHOLARS.

Notre Dame is a co-educational school run by the Marist Fathers and Brothers, and is welcoming to students and families of all faiths. We are an authorized International Baccalaureate World School, providing the Middle Years Programme (MYP) to freshmen and sophomores, and offering the prestigious Diploma Programme (DP) to juniors and seniors.

As a student at Notre Dame, you'll start your school day at 7:45 a.m., and finish at 2:45 p.m. You'll carry eight courses, but sit for five 55-minutes classes per day in an eight-day rotating schedule. Each day you'll have Community Time, giving you 35 minutes to meet with clubs, catch up on schoolwork, collaborate with peers, or visit with a teacher/advisor in a small-group setting.

At Notre Dame, you will be given opportunities to challenge yourself in multiple ways. Ultimately these opportunities will prepare you to follow Christ, serve others and seek wisdom, the goal for every Notre Dame graduate.

ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

The admissions process at Notre Dame is designed to build a diverse student body that strives to fulfill all the major components of our school mission in developing Christians, citizens and scholars. Though Notre Dame serves a predominantly Roman Catholic population, applicants from other Christian denominations or non-Christian faiths are welcome. Based on this approach, Notre Dame focuses on attracting students prepared to thrive in a challenging academic program and interested in becoming a contributor to our learning community through their development in arts, athletics, leadership and faith life. Notre Dame’s model applicant strives to grow in all these areas.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO NOTRE DAME PREPARATORY SCHOOL (GRADES 9–12)

- Complete the online application.
- Submit Academic Information Request form to student’s current school (online).
- Submit Student Evaluation forms to student’s current teachers (online).
- Take the High School Placement Test (Grade 9 applicants). See testing dates to the left of this page. Grade 9 applicants who test after Dec. 7 will be ineligible to receive merit-based scholarships.
- Interview.

ADMISSION TO NOTRE DAME

Notre Dame begins accepting applications in October, and reviews applicants once all requirements have been met. Applicants to 9th grade must wait until Jan. 24 for their decision, per the Archdiocese of Detroit. The initial deadline for applications is Jan. 17. After that date, applicants may continue to pursue admission and ultimately register as space permits. Registration for the 2020–21 school year opens Jan. 27.

SHADOWING AT NOTRE DAME

Parents wishing to schedule their student to be “Irish for a Day” may call the Notre Dame Office of Enrollment Management at 248-373-1061, or schedule online by visiting <http://www.ndpma.org/shadow>.

TUITION AT NOTRE DAME

Notre Dame utilizes a 12-month tuition calendar, beginning in February. In addition to tuition, students are assessed fees for materials such as a tablet, apps, books, etc. Tuition for 2019-20 is \$16,451

FINANCIAL AID AT NOTRE DAME

Notre Dame is happy to partner with parents wishing to realize an education for their child(ren) at our school. All families are welcome to apply online for assistance through Financial Aid for School Tuition (FAST), which requires tax documentation and W2s as part of its application. The review period for new families runs from Dec. 1 to Feb. 1. Applications will be accepted after that date, as long as funds remain available. Qualified applicants in the aforementioned two-month review window will receive notice of an award in their student’s letter of acceptance. Awards are applied on Sept. 1.

Fine & Performing Arts Scholarships (9)

Notre Dame awards band, choir and visual arts scholarships of up to \$1,000 for the freshman year. Electronic submissions are due on an appointed date in early April each school year.

ADDITIONAL NON-MERIT AWARDS

Alumni Award

Children of NDP, NDHS (Harper Woods), Oakland Catholic and Pontiac Catholic alumni are eligible for yearly discounts in tuition at NDP. The award is \$1,000 for the first student and is prorated for additional students. Alumni awards cannot be combined with other merit, academic or financial aid awards.

Diversity Scholarship

Students may qualify for a Diversity Scholarship for the first year of attendance at NDP. The award is based on the student response to the diversity statement in the application for admission.
