NOTRE DAME PREPARATORY SCHOOL 2020 – 2021 Profile



Notre Dame Preparatory School and Marist Academy is a co-educational, Pre-K through 12th grade Catholic school in Southeast Michigan. Cardinal Adam Maida, archbishop of Detroit, invited the Marist Fathers and Brothers to sponsor a school in Oakland County in 1994. Nestled on a 100-acre campus in Pontiac, Mich., the school currently is in its 27th year.

NOTE: In March 2020, with the onset of the pandemic, NDPMA transitioned to online learning. During virtual learning, students continued with their college prep curriculum. Teachers hosted Zoom classroom meetings and lessons, and students accessed their assignments online eight-day rotating schedule and students were responsible

Notre Dame provides its diverse student body a Catholic and internationally recognized collegepreparatory experience of lasting value. We work with God to form Christian people, upright citizens and academic scholars.

Beginning in August 2020, Notre Dame students returned to in-person learning. A synchronous learning option has been made available for students who have health concerns,









FACULTY

Seventy-two (72) faculty members educate 962 students across three distinct but coordinated academic divisions: Notre Dame Lower School (Pre-K through 5), Notre Dame Middle School (6-8), and Notre Dame Preparatory School (9-12). Three out of four hold a post-graduate degree.

SCHEDULE

For the 2020-2021 school year, Notre Dame Prep students will be following an A/B rotating schedule. Four of eight classes meet each day for eighty minutes.

CURRICULUM

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

Notre Dame was the first Michigan authorized as an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School and the first Catholic school in the United States to offer the IB curriculum at all grade levels. Students may pursue the two-year IB Diploma Programme or continue with other college-preparatory courses. Eighteen (18) out of 21 student candidates earned an IB diploma in 2020.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Beginning in 10th grade, students may choose from 13 Advanced Placement (AP) courses in an array of disciplines. In 2020, 295 students took 484 exams; 322 earned a 3 or higher; 73 were named an AP Scholar or better.
